



## Engineering and Management

If you are enrolled in your third year of study in an Engineering program you are eligible to apply for the Management program. In the Management program, you will take an additional year of business courses (30 credits) and the notation “and Management” will appear on your degree.

If you would like to apply for the Management program, [fill out a Change of Program application](#) and submit it to the Registrar’s office by Tuesday, March 31, 2015. You are eligible to apply for the Management program if you have successfully completed at least 54 credit hours and hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.3. Please note that late applications will not be accepted.

All applications will be reviewed on a competitive basis once winter grades are released and you will be notified of the outcome of your application via your UOITnet email account. If you are a successful applicant, your program will be changed and you will be eligible to enroll in the Management courses when registration opens in July.
